

MASS EVENT SECURITY REGULATIONS

1. The organizer of the mass event in the Legions Hall (Hala Legionów) located at Leszka Drogosza Street, no 2, in Kielce, is the Karate Sports Club in Kielce (Kielecki Klub Sportowy Karate).
2. The owner of the Legions Hall is the Municipal Sports and Recreation Center in Kielce (MOSIR Kielce).
3. The organizer of a mass event is obliged to ensure the safety of people and order at the event, in accordance with the Act on the safety of mass events of March 20, 2009 (Journal of Laws of 2015, item 2139 of December 18, 2015).
4. The use of the Legions Hall is allowed for the public, provided holding an admission ticket, a pass, other document entitling to enter, or an ID card issued by the Organizer, and acting in compliance with the event regulations, area regulations and safety and order rules in a public place.
5. Persons present at the event are obliged to act in a manner that does not endanger the safety of other persons present at the event.
6. During a mass event, persons present at the event are not allowed to bring:
 - Gas sprays
 - Weapons and knives
 - Regular and telescopic batons
 - Pocket knives
 - Umbrellas with a sharp points
 - Pyrotechnics, e.g. firecrackers, sparklers, flares
 - Petrol/lighter gas
 - Chains
 - Large metal objects
 - Alcohol
 - Psychotropic drugs
 - Drugs
 - Syringes with needles (without a certificate from a medical doctor)
 - Tablets in loose or open packaging (closed containers and tablet strips allowed)
 - Cameras with optical zoom above 6x + professional cameras (including with interchangeable lenses) and video cameras
 - Selfie sticks and camera stands (not applicable to media representatives)
 - Perfumes in a large glass bottle
 - Spray deodorants
 - Pressurized containers, including sprays
 - Hairsprays

- Hair gels
- Combs finished with a metal skewer (ordinary allowed)
- Large metal nail files (small ones allowed)
- Scissors (small nail polish allowed)
- Large mirrors (small makeup allowed)
- Portable tourist chairs, drones, skateboards, scooters
- Tourist refrigerators (not applicable to competitors)
- Sandwiches in aluminum foil in large quantities (individual pieces allowed)
- All kinds of animals (except guide dogs for the blind)
- Thermoses
- Metal, glass or porcelain cups
- Beverages in plastic, glass and cans
- Beverages in cardboard boxes above 0.33 liter
- Flags on poles, shafts, masts and bows (only flags allowed)
- Large quantities of advertising leaflets and newsletters not related to the event and not approved by the organizer
- Banners with obscene language
- Large batteries, type R20, R12 "flat" (AA and AAA fingers allowed)

The following items can be brought into the festival area:

- Nail polishes
- Chewing Gum
- Open packages with food in small amounts
- Power banks with charging cables

7. Persons under the influence of intoxicants, alcohol, acting aggressively or having items specified in point 6 of the Regulation, refusing to submit to the inspection specified in point 16 of the Regulation, and people against whom a club ban has been issued or a mass events ban has been imposed.

8. Sales of alcoholic beverages during the mass event are not allowed.

9. Devastation and the use of the hall infrastructure (eg toilets) for purposes inconsistent with their intended use is prohibited.

10. The mass event organizer ensures safe and collision-free leaving of the event area by marking exits in accordance with the evacuation plan.

11. The organizer provides personnel and security services in the amount accordant with the Act on the safety of mass events of March 20, 2009 (Journal of Laws of 2015, item 2139 of December 18, 2015).
12. The medical aid point for cases of necessary assistance is located on the premises of the event and is clearly marked.
13. The organizer's information point is located on the premises of the event and is clearly designated.
14. The organizer is not responsible for items left in the event area.
15. Catering stands should meet the requirements set out in the Act on the circulation of foodstuffs in door-to-door trade, with particular emphasis on the positive opinion of the Sanitary Inspection.
16. The organizer's security services are entitled to:
 - a) identifying people to establish their identity,
 - b) checking tickets, passes and other documents entitling to enter the mass event area,
 - c) viewing the contents of the luggage, and clothing in case of suspicion of bringing items referred to in point 6),
 - d) issuing orders to persons disturbing public order or behaving inconsistently with the rules of the mass event, and in the event of failure to comply with these orders - calling them to leave the mass event,
 - e) detaining for the immediate transfer to the Police of persons posing a direct threat to life, human health, and protected property.
17. Persons entering the event are obliged to present an admission ticket, pass, other document authorizing entry or an ID issued by the Organizer without being called to by the security guard.
18. Journalists and the press can enter the mass event area after showing their press accreditation.
19. People present at the mass event are required to take the place designated on the ticket, pass or other document authorizing entry, issued by the Organizer.
20. Persons staying on the premises of the event are obliged to follow the instructions of the security staff in order to ensure safety and order. For safety reasons, participants of the mass event should strictly follow the recommendations of the security services and follow the announcer's instructions.
21. The ID of the security worker includes: the identification number and facial image, expiry date of the ID, name of the issuer, stamp of the issuer, and the signature of the person issuing the ID.
22. In the event of non-compliance with the orders to leave the mass event, a member of the security service is entitled to use means of direct coercion in order to a person outside the mass event area.
23. In order to ensure the safety of a mass event, the provisions of the Act on the Safety of Mass Events of March 20, 2009 (Journal of Laws of 2015, item 2139 of December 18, 2015) shall apply.
24. It is forbidden to destroy devices and equipment located on the premises of the event.

25. Everyone present at the event should behave in a way that does not pose a threat to other participants of the event.
26. Everyone present at the event is obliged to respect public property, and greenery and not to clutter the event area.
27. In the event of a threat to safety at the event, the organization team at the event site must be notified immediately and the orders and instructions issued by the rescue and security services should be followed.
28. Failure to comply with the regulations may result in criminal liability.
29. The regulations will be made available to the participants of the event on the organizer's website and by displaying them at the entrances to the event area.
